"IRS Data Warehouse Security needs improvement

At its core, the IRS's Data Warehouse (CWD) is a massive data warehouse containing multiple years of Federal Tax Information and

Personally Identifiable Information. A total of 1,173 people, including 291 contractors and 20 researchers and student volunteers" have broad access to everyone's data and can remotely download database contents onto IRS-issued laptops. None of the milestones created to implement corrective action plans for the vulnerabilities were created within agency-defined timelines."

"The personal details of hundreds of thousands of New Zealanders has been handed to platforms such as Facebook and Google to help better target Inland Revenue Department (IRD) ads. The agency has long asserted that the practice involves anonymising personal information.

But an IRD spokesperson said officials are now reviewing whether it's "still safe" to use the process after warnings from US and European regulators that information could still be linked back with people's identities."

Your predecessor <u>ignored a call to dialogue</u> from the Chair of the EU's Data Protection Working Group. I hope that you will accept my invitation to engage in a discussion on these issues.
